There will no activity on the Google classroom(s) over the summer. You may of course continue to access any of your classrooms, but please do not expect to hear from your teachers during the summer holidays.

We are looking forward to the time that we will all be able to be together again. We have enjoyed listening to your voice via School Council class representatives Zoom meeting(s), Registration group Zoom meeting(s), Senior Prefect Team Zoom meeting(s) as well as via the online pupil survey feedback. This has all helped us to understand what lockdown has been like for you. It has also been important for us to hear what matters to you as we plan together towards our return to school from the end of August.
